Step 5 – Read this statement and sign form:

The Old Hickory Council of the Boy Scouts of America requires Pack 934 to file a Boy Scout Tour Permit for all scouting events that take place > 5 miles away from Mount Tabor United Methodist Church. To ensure compliance with Boy Scout rules and regulations, please read the below statements and sign to acknowledge your willingness to comply with the following statements:

- All vehicles must be covered by a public liability and property damage liability insurance policy.
- The amount of this coverage must meet or exceed the insurance requirement of the state in which the vehicle is licensed. ((It is recommended, however, that coverage limits are at least \$50,000/\$100,000/\$50,000 or \$100,000 combined single limit.)
- Any vehicle carrying 10 or more passengers is required to have limits of \$100,000/\$500,000/\$100,000 or \$500,000 combined single limit.
- In the case of rented vehicles, the requirement of coverage limits can be met by combining the limits of personal coverage carried by the driver with coverage carried by the owner of the rented vehicle.
- Driver must have a valid driver's license and be at least 18 years of age.
- Driver will travel at reasonable speed in accordance with state and local laws.

Directions:

From I-40W:

1. Take exit 86 onto Hwy 226N to Marion, NC.
2. Continue toward Spruce Pine until you reach the Blue Ridge Parkway.
3. Take the Parkway south to Hwy 80, approximately 12 miles.
4. Follow Hwy 80N toward Burnsville approximately 4 miles.
5. Turn left on South Toe River Road;
6. Follow signs to Black Mountain Campground.
7. Briar Bottom Group is adjacent to Black Mountain Campground. Access is available through the main gate at Black Mountain Campground.
